Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S”) § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the Arizona State Board of Podiatry Examiners (“Board”) and to the general public that the Board will hold a meeting open to the public on **Wednesday, February 8, 2023 at 8:00 a.m.** The meeting will be held in Boardroom C located at 1740 West Adams Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85007. One or more members of the Board may participate in the meeting by telephonic communications.

The meeting is open to the public. However, the Board may vote to go into Executive Session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3) for any matter listed on the Agenda in order to obtain legal advice from counsel. In addition, the Board may vote to go into Executive Session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) as indicated on the Agenda for the purpose of considering or reviewing records exempt by law from public inspection, including the receipt and discussion of information or testimony that is specifically required to be maintained as confidential by state or federal law. The executive session is not open to the public.

However, members of the Board are not allowed to discuss or take legal action on matters raised during an open call to the public unless the matters are properly noticed for discussion and legal action. The Board, however, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda.
